The residence permit tells how many hours you're allowed to work. You get your BSN as a result of your registration in your local city hall.

### Get health insurance

A Dutch health insurance is mandatory when you make > €150/month or > €1.500/year. Save money by applying for health allowance.

### Work permit

Your employer needs to apply for a work permit for you. This takes 5-8 weeks. After that you're ready to work.



### Ask for an income tax refund

You pay income tax over your earnings. You can save money by applying for a income tax refund.

You are entitled to student finance (and student travel) if you work > 56 hours/month (only during the months you reach the 56 hours).
